

**Town of Perryville
Special Meeting Minutes
October 10, 2017**

ATTENDANCE: Mayor: James Eberhardt, Commissioners: Michelle Linkey, Pete Reich, Robert Ashby Jr., Town Administrator: Denise Breder

Absent: Ray Ryan III

The Town of Perryville meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Eberhardt.

Emergency Ordinance 2017-20 -Water System Emergencies

After a brief discussion among the board changes were made to Emergency Ordinance prior to the introduction.

Commissioner Linkey stated the changes: Section F. (7) Subsection D.

- Remove: and the town's facebook page and;
- Place a comma after website and after government matters
- Add: and all other available media. (after government matters)

Mayor Eberhardt stated changes to Section G. (7)

- Add: will result in a warning, second offense is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine in the amount of \$150, \$300 for a third offense, and \$500 for a fourth and subsequent offenses. (after violation of a water conservation restriction)

Mayor Eberhardt Introduced Emergency Ordinance 2017-20 -Water System Emergencies as follows:

An Emergency Ordinance concerning Water System Emergencies for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor to declare a water system emergency and impose mandatory water use restrictions under certain circumstances and under certain conditions; providing for public notice of a water system emergency and mandatory water use restrictions; providing penalties and enforcement for violations of mandatory water use restrictions; and generally relating to water system emergencies in the Town of Perryville.

Motion was made by Commissioner Linkey and seconded by Commissioner Reich to move that the board waive the prohibition in Section C4-1 of the Town Charter against passing an Ordinance at the meeting at which it is introduced so that the board may vote on Emergency Ordinance 2017-20 tonight as an Emergency Ordinance. **All in Favor: Motion Carried.**

Motion was made by Commissioner Linkey and seconded by Commissioner Ashby to approve Emergency Ordinance 2017-20. **All in Favor: Motion Carried.**

Mayor Eberhardt stated that things are looking somewhat better today, he does not see any reason to call an emergency now, the towers are filling up. We could possibly be getting the emergency processing unit on Friday. Also, Zenon has found another permanent filter not being used so we could possibly be getting the second filter the second week of November.

Commissioner Reich stated that the cost may be around \$5,000 more because of it being expedited so we may need to do another budget amendment, plus there is overtime and other expenses involved to be taken into consideration.

Mayor Eberhardt stated that the emergency unit is \$37,000 a month to rent and right now we are paying \$300 a load to have water delivered, which is adding up quickly for the total amount of loads needed.

Commissioner Reich thought that the cost for the emergency unit was \$28,500.

Ms. Breder commented that when looking at the contract it calculated out to about \$37,000, but George put the purchase order in for \$28,500.

Commissioner Reich commented that originally George was looking to get a 400 gallon per minute unit and maybe he just went with a 200 to 250 gallon per minute unit.


Commissioner Linkey stated that the hoses have been replaced that are running to the VA.

Commissioner Linkey announced that the kayaks that were supposed to be at the park never happened due to water safety issues.

Mayor Eberhardt asked that Public Works power wash the Outreach front porch since it sits next to the construction site of the Police building once the current water issue improves, along with putting sealer on the ramp.

Motion was made by Commissioner Reich and seconded by Commissioner Ashby to adjourn the October 10, 2017 Special Meeting at 7:12 p.m. **All in Favor: Motion Carried.**
