What is an illicit Discharge?

Federal EPA regulations define an illicit discharge as any discharge to a municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) that is not composed entirely of stormwater with few exceptions. Some exceptions include discharges from EPA permitted (NPDES) industrial sources and discharges from fire-fighting activities. Illicit discharges are considered illicit because MS4s are not designed to accept, process, or discharge such non-stormwater wastes.

To all Town of Perryville residents, an Illicit Discharge can be -

Any trash, garbage, or spilled motor oil / antifreeze / gasoline on the sidewalks or streets left unattended.

To all Perryville Home Owners, an Illicit Discharge can be -

Yard waste such as excess grass clippings or dead leaves & branches on the yard left unattended. The draining of chlorinated swimming pool water into the Town storm drains.

To all Perryville Pet Owners, an Illicit Discharge can be -

Pet waste left unattended.
